**Sheen intercession cited in area boy's alleged miraculous healing**

That James Fulton Engstrom is celebrating his first birthday on Friday is amazing. In fact, some would call his life a miracle. Considered stillborn on Sept. 16, 2009 after a healthy pregnancy and "a beautiful, short labor," James was without a pulse for the first six minutes of his life. It was only when doctors at OHSF Saint Francis Medical Center in Peoria were ready to call the time of death that his little heart started beating.

His parents, Travis and Rosette Engstrom, believe James is alive due to the intercession of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Servant of God.

On Sept. 5, a tribunal of inquiry was sworn in to investigate the Goodfield boy's alleged miraculous healing, joining James and his family at the ceremony in the Lady of Hospital Holy Chapel in Peoria.

Spelling Reversal Center in Peoria with Bishop Daniel R. Jenks, CSC, Dr. Andrew Aronson, petitioner for Archbishop Sheen's cause for beatification and canonization, and members of the Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen Translation Board, some of whom are relatives of the late archbishop. In addition to Bishop Jenks and Dr. Aronson, those sworn in were:

- Msgr. James Gray, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Peoria and judicial vicar of the diocese's Marriage Tribunal. Designated the episcopal delegate to the Sheen Tribunal, he is responsible for guiding the process.
- Father James Kruse, vicar general of the Diocese of Peoria and pastor of St. Mark's Parish in East Peoria. A representative of justice in his duty to make sure that canon law is followed.
- Fr. Louis Varvia, who practices Family

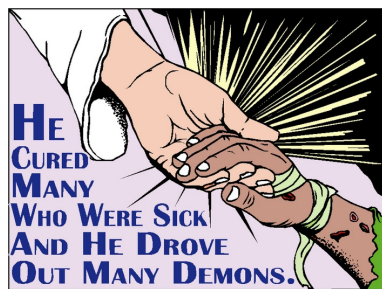

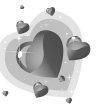

# Carroll SCRIP



Love is in the Air ...  
and so are the rebates!



During the month of **FEBRUARY** the SCRIP credit will be flip flopped for families who participate. This means families will be credited 75% of their total scrip profit while the school is credited 25%. Don't forget if a grandparent or parishioner identifies a Carroll family as the seller, then 75% of their SCRIP profit will go the family, thus doubling the reward for the family!

For example, an average family may spend the following per month resulting in the average SCRIP profit:

	Monthly Expense	Average %	SCRIP Profit
Groceries	\$600	5%	\$30.00
Gasoline	\$200	5%	\$10.00
Dining Out	\$200	10%	\$20.00
Clothing	\$200	6%	\$12.00
Entertainment	\$50	9%	\$4.50
Gift Given	\$50	9%	\$4.50

In this example the total earned for the month of February is \$81.00, so the family will receive \$60.75. The General Carroll School Fund, which pays for salaries, utilities, and general school expenses will receive \$20.25.

Don't forget to use gift cards to buy candy and valentines for the kids to pass out at school, or to plan a romantic evening with that special someone. Plus, every time you make a Valentine's Day purchase with gift cards, you also show love for our school with the rebates you earn. It doesn't get much sweeter than that!
